A New Local Plan

North Lincolnshire Council is preparing a new single Local Plan for North Lincolnshire. Once agreed (formally adopted), it will replace the current North Lincolnshire Local Plan, the Core Strategy and the Housing and Employment Land Allocations Development Plan Documents (DPDs).

WHAT IS A LOCAL PLAN AND HOW IT AFFECTS YOU?

A Local Plan sets out:

- The vision and objectives for the future development of the area, addressing needs and opportunities in relation to housing, the economy, community facilities and infrastructure – as well as a basis for safeguarding the environment, adapting to climate change and securing good design.
- The policies and proposals that will guide decisions and investment on development and regeneration up to 2036.

It is important that we get the Local Plan right so that North Lincolnshire continues to be a place where people want to live, work, invest and play. The plan will help to deliver the council's vision—to be 'an area of aspiring people and inspiring places.'

A Local Plan should be aspirational but realistic and provide enough flexibility to adjust to rapid change. Therefore, it must be based upon up to date facts (sound evidence).

WHY DO WE NEED A NEW LOCAL PLAN?

Two reasons:

- A change in legislation (law) – since the Core Strategy was adopted, the legislative requirement for plan making has changed and the Government's preferred approach is for each local planning authority to prepare a single Local Plan for its area.
- The Core Strategy needs to be reviewed/updated to take account of national planning policy changes.

LOCAL PLAN STAGES

- Stage 1 (2017) - Initial consultation (Regulation 18)
 - We'll gather evidence for the issues we need to address.
- Stage 2 (2017) - Issues & Options (Regulation 18)
 - We'll consider how best to address the issues.
- Stage 3 (2017) - Preferred Options (Regulation 18)
 - We'll consult on the preferred policies & site allocations/designations needed to deliver the plan's vision & spatial objectives based on the findings from the Issues & Options stage.
- Stage 4 (2018) - Draft Local Plan
 - We'll publish a draft plan with supporting evidence, request stakeholder and community views.
- Stage 5 (2018/19) - Local Plan Submission
 - We'll submit the plan and supporting evidence to the Government's Planning Inspectorate—examination (testing).
- Stage 6 (2018/19) - Adoption
 - We'll formally adopt the new plan, providing it's been prepared correctly, and use it to determine planning applications.
