

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF SOUTH KILLINGHOLME PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 4TH
DECEMBER 2017 AT SOUTH KILLINGHOLME COMMUNITY CENTRE

1) Apologies: Ward Cllrs Clark, Wells and Hannigan

2) Mr Jonathan Brown addressed the meeting. He is the co-ordinator of the Humber Emergency Plan for North and North East Lincolnshire. He gave each parish councillor 3 documents, a copy of the 2010 emergency plan for South Killingholme, a questionnaire to be completed and returned to him and a guidance document. His dept will then use a template to produce a plan from our information. This they will then store and pass to the emergency services, He also explained the need for the council to have an emergency team to respond to any emergency. He asked if we had an emergency box – Cllr Evans confirmed one was put together but its current whereabouts is unknown, after several changes of council. Evacuation points are needed if asked to leave for our own safety. He is able to help with posters and letter templates etc.

5) Public Forum

Members of the public brought up the following items

1. Dip in path in School Rd This has been reported, partially repaired and repair due to be completed

4. Questions about the mums and toddlers group and their policies It was pointed out this is not run by the Parish Council
5. Questions about the whereabouts of the clerk and why the Chair had not responded to questions on facebook It was explained that employees are not discussed in a public meeting. Following abuse to councillors and continual shouting the member was asked by the Chair to leave the meeting . They refused but quietened down.
6. 3 street lights needing attention on Top Rd and Ulceby Rd.

6) North Lincolnshire Councillors reports – no councillors were in attendance

7) Chair's report

Nats meeting had been attended. Christmas Party for over 60s to be held on 8th December by CAG. White lines in village have been redone. Roads have now been swept. The reported hedge has been cut. Flashing lights requested outside school. Speed check on Green gate Lane installed.

8) Correspondence

Letter from Clerk – not brought to this meeting

Ian Jickells from N Lincs Council had emailed re various items. School has said it has no problems with parking. Double yellow lines on School Rd and St Denys would require a legal process. Zebra crossing on Greengate Lane – if the village wants it – would require an assessment but would likely be at nos. 24 and 26. Also problems with vehicles going wrong way down Staple Rd and lorries parking longer than 2 hrs on the layby were reported to the meeting.

9) Planning

Planning application from Minories (formerly Schenker)

It was decided to object to the 24 hour working, as disturbance to nearby residents, increased noise, night disturbances and rebuttal of the claim that this had been going on before without objections.

10) Financial matters

November's accounts not presented as the clerk was not present.

Gas bill - to be explained and dealt with

Npower – bill to be queried and paid by direct debit

XLN – it was agreed to pay the amount stated

Budget – the figures given by the clerk were accepted

Precept – the figures given by the clerk were gone through and assessed and judged to be accurate and therefore accepted with no increase from last year

North Lincs Grass Cutting invoice – now amended so accepted and payment agreed

Flower and vases for community centre – payment of £10 agreed

Monthly cleaning budget – item deferred until end of meeting

December salaries – payment agreed

Co-op bank account - to be deferred until end of meeting

Bar repairs and light – Cllr Jervis to consult with her son, and electrician, re likely costs etc.

11. Telephone and broadband

This is paid by direct debit. Although a cheaper one might be available it was decided to research this in the New Year.

12) Police matters - none apart from a reporting of thefts in the village.

13) Parish Matters

Problems with rubbish on Fauldings Lane reported by Cllr K Hesketh

Cllr Morbin reported the street light at the gate of the Community Centre not working,

Cllr Jervis concerned that the mobile library does not call at all at S Killingholme South

Cllr Crofts asked by several people if Four Paws had appropriate planning consent for large new building. Enquiries to be made.

Speed cameras - Cllr Crofts had received email from Cllr Hannigan and would forward it to interested councillors

40mps speed limit on dual carriageway discussed but not voted on

Give ways signs discussed but not voted on.

Safety issues with new roundabout – Highways England informed of recent accident with police presence.

Concerns about Poplar Farm running road sweepers and perhaps the crusher again
